**Los Angeles, CA** - *Dimensions of Spirituality – Rosh HaShanah, Yom Kippur and Sukkot*, is the first of two exchange exhibitions between the Jewish Art Salon and the Southern California Jewish Artists Initiative. This inaugural collaborative exhibition, curated by Richard McBee and Aimee Rubenstein, presents 15 Jewish Art Salon member artists exploring the concepts of Jewish ritual, reflection and tradition. Ranging from painting, photography and mixed media, the art on view will encourage viewers to become immersed in the variegated themes of Rosh HaShanah, Yom Kippur and Sukkot. In time for the 2017 High Holidays, the Southern California Jewish Arts Initiative will mount a similarly themed exhibition at a New York venue.
